## **Module Group**

The next scheduled event will be in Mt. Hope, about 12 miles south of Dalton and near Berlin in Wayne county. This show is in our most southern Holmes County and is within our Division. We will be making a presence deep in Amish country and on a day that the Amish can attend. This will be a new experience. The address is Mt. Hope Event Center, 8076 St. Rt. 241, Mt. Hope, OH 44660 (Millersburg, OH 44654 for some GPS), 1-330-262-7488. The Berlin Grande Hotel, 4787 Township Road, Berlin, OH 44610, 1-330-403-3050, has a block of rooms available at a special rate if you wish to spend the night. Mention "Jon Ulbright Train Show."

The show is scheduled for Saturday, March 24, 2018. We will set up on Friday, March 23. This will be difficult if you have a job. We will be relying on our retirees to do most of the work. We will be operating the HO modules, only. **Everyone should help operate the modules regardless of the scale your model.** Please mark your calendars and be sure to come help us set up and operate the modules. Plan to eat here, also, because it will be catered by "Mrs. Yoder's Kitchen," the famous Amish restaurant.

Two weeks later, the next scheduled event will be the Youngstown Model Railroad Association Flea Market at Salem, OH, Sunday, April 8, 2018, at the CenterPlex Community Center, 1098 North Ellsworth Ave, Salem, OH 44460. We will set up at 1 PM on Saturday, April 7. We also expect to operate at the Stark County Fair, again, August 28, through Labor Day, September 3, 2018.

The new HO fiddle yard modules are 22' in length and have (4) sidings accessible from both ends. This allows a train to pass through without having to back out to the local main track. Fiddle yards are there to allow you to set up a train and test a locomotive, including "programming on the main." Leaving them sit in the yard while you see the show without approval is not good. Be courteous and remove the train or let someone else operate it while you are gone.

Module Group members who have added scenery to their modules should apply for the "Golden Spike" Award. The scenery is the last thing we do to finish a module.

Those of you who want a module; you need to contact me so I can order electrical components and more lumber. See my emal and phone numbers below. We will schedule a date to build the module(s). The final price will be around \$110.00 for the kit. Those who build a 4' x 2' module with scenery, which is eight square feet minimum, can apply for the "Golden Spike" and other AP awards.

We are always looking for venues where we can display and operate our modules. We can be an added attraction for many events, i.e., Railroad Days, shows at event centers, library historical programs, student events, etc. Please call me or any Module Group member if you think you have a lead and make sure the event coordinator is aware of your concern.

The Division portion of the 50-50 raffle is placed in the module fund. This fund is shared with the HO and Ntrak groups as needed for division owned equipment. Privately owned modules and equipment are the responsibility of the owner. All request for funds are to be presented to the Module Chairman.

#### Division 1, MCR, NMRA Minutes February 18, 2018 Kent Free Library, Kent, Ohio

- I. **Welcome:** The business meeting was called to order at 2:06 pm by Superintendent Jim DiPaola. A moment of silence was taken in remembrance of Dale Smith, Harley Smith's son, and Rich Mayich from Division-4. Two new members introduced themselves: John Spinks from Akron and Clint Foster who lives in Warren and had been in Division-9.
- II. Minutes: A correction to the January minutes as they appeared in the <u>Peddler Freight</u> was pointed out in that we received \$125 and not \$200 for the module setup in Salem. A motion was made to accept the corrected minutes for the January 2018 meeting. The motion was seconded and passed.
- III. **Treasurer's Report:** The report was given by Treasurer Mike Bradley. A motion was made and seconded to accept the January 2018 Treasurer's report subject to audit. The motion passed.

#### IV. Committee Reports:

- A. <u>Clinics</u> Jim Peters announced that Bruce Hukill would put on a weathering clinic after the meeting. A clinic is still needed for May.
- B. <u>AP</u> Jim Peters stated that Steve Zapytowski could judge scenery applicants. And it was learned that Clint Foster could also judge scenery. A replacement for Jim is needed as AP chairman. Jim currently has 10 layouts for the spring layout tour. There is a flier on Facebook.
- C. Peddler Freight Bruce Hukill had nothing new to report.
- D. <u>Apparel</u> Jim Williams reviewed the new "Bullet" convention shirts that were available in black and steel grey and in long-sleeve and short-sleeve for men and women.
- E. <u>Membership</u> Jim DiPaola reported that he had talked to Larry Brown this morning. Larry said that he is working 7 days a week and could no longer be the chair of this committee. He was going to renew his membership and would still try to attend the shows where the modules were setup. Jim also said that after this phone call he had one from Joe Urbanski who volunteered to chair the membership committee.
- F. **Scale Update** No report.
- G. Modules Bob Ashley Sr. stated that the next module setup will be for the Mt. Hope train show on March 24<sup>th</sup>. This will be followed by the second Salem show two weeks after. John Ulbright had told him that he did not have room for the N-scale modules and only wanted the HO modules in an L-shape form. This show is on Saturday, 3/24 and setup is Friday from 3-6 pm. There is a block of discount rooms reserved at the Berlin Grand Hotel. The show will be catered by Mrs. Yoder's Kitchen. We need volunteers to setup, run trains, and tear down. Bob also reported that he had added a new fiddle yard behind his modules which will belong to the division. He asked to be reimbursed \$454 for this addition. A motion was made, seconded and approved to reimburse him.

#### VI. Bring-n-Brag:

- A. Chuck Altwies brought in some small plastic bottles that he offered to anyone that wanted one.
- B. Bob Ashley Jr. reported that he had purchased and installed on his layout a Digitrax LMWI module that allows him to use up to 4 smart phones as throttles. It eliminates using a laptop, JMRI, and a router that you used to have to employ to do this. He will try this out on the modules at Mt. Hope.
- C. Jim Williams pointed out a picture in the back of the room of a 3'x8' layout table he was offering for free to anyone who wanted it.

#### VII. Old Business:

- A. Changes to the by-laws: A motion was made to accept the changes as read in the last meeting and published in the Peddler Freight. The motion was seconded and passed.
- B. Mike Bradley presented the yearly costs for additional insurance for the division: \$250 for division property (DVD's and tapes), \$300 for the modules and \$238 for liability coverage for the officers. A discussion ensued as to how we would sustain these premiums going forward if we did not have any regular income. It was decided that we did not need the coverage for the division property. A motion was made for the division to pay the \$538 for the module and liability coverage for this year. In coming years, the module fund might cover their insurance and the division would pay for the liability coverage. The motion was seconded and passed.
- C. 2018 Convention (Steve Zapytowski):
  - A. \$2,000 was transferred for the division checking account to the convention account.
  - B. \$45 was spent on a table at Gary Kohler's Narrow Gauge Show, March 23-24. 6 volunteers are needed. They will have free access to the show and a \$5 chit to use towards food.
  - C. \$15 was spent on a 3x7 add in the Narrow Gauge Show advertisement.
  - D. The tri-fold is completed and will be ordered as well as pens and note pads.
  - E. The early registration form is completed and on the website. The registration form is also completed.
  - F. \$75 was spent to register our credit card operation with the bank.

- G. The budget for the convention was based on the data from 7 prior conventions. The budget is \$21,000 to host it and \$32,000 expected income based on an average of 200 attendees.
- D. Jim Peters presented some examples of chart tape that he had talked about in last month's meeting.

VIII. New Business:

A. Election committee: Bob Ashley, Jr., Derek Shoup and Joe Urbanski volunteered with Bob as chair.

IX. Good of the Order

A. Jim Peters issued a crew call for anyone interested in operating his layout for scheduled op-sessions.

29 people attended.

A motion was made and seconded to adjourn the meeting. The motion passed. The business meeting adjourned at 3:20 pm.

#### N-SCALE REPORT

**Division 1 Regional avoids annual conflict.** 2018 MCR regional is the same weekend (May 17 - 20) as the 10th Ohio N-Scale Weekend (18 - 20). It is nice to see that Division 1's Regional is planned for May 2 - 5, 2019 thus avoiding the annual conflict with the N-Scale Weekend. This should allow N scalers and their vendors the chance to attend the regional. It may also be possible to include another N-Scale module layout if space allows. Avoidance of this type of conflict is right in line with Charlie Getz's recent editorial on how NMRA is all inclusive, not just an HO organization.

Atlas ACY RS1 showed by Bruce Hukill at last month's "Bring-n-Brag" is not DCC ready or available with a decoder. Fortunately "TCS" has a CN series decoder for this locomotive that does not require machining of locomotive frame. It is necessary to disassemble the loco to allow for electrical isolation of the frame from the motor via Kapton tape and soldering of 5 wires. Nine pages of detailed installation instructions are available which include excellent photos on how to proceed.

Coming Products from Fox Valley/N—Scale Enthusiast are NS, AC44C6M in 3 color schemes: blue cab/gold flame, black/red and black cab/blue flame, response by 2/15/18 was requested but shipping is not until 3rd or 4th quarter. The blue/gold scheme really looks great. --- Fox Valley GE-ES44-G1 in P&LE black and yellow. --- Micro-Trains coming in April are ATSF 40' double door "Slogan" cars. --- Bluford Shops, Steel bay window cabooses. --- Scale Trains, GE Tier 4 GEVo in 7 road names. --- Atlas. Atlas Master N GP-7/9 Locomotives. --- Intermountain. GP-10 the Paducah rebuilds.

**2018, 26th National N Scale Convention** is June 19 to June 24 in Salt Lake City, Utah. Actual convention starts on the 20th, but there is an extra fare trip on the 19th to Ogden for a tour of four museums and Golden Spike Site and engine house. Museums include Utah Railroad, Browning Firearms, Browning-Kimble Classic cars and the Utah Cowboy Western Heritage Museum. Trains, guns, classic cars and cowboys make for a great day. This is of course followed by a great convention. One of the biggest costs is getting there; round trip \$370 and 8 to 10 hours by plane or \$600+ and 40+ hours by train. Registration is now open.

#### AC&Y Bullet 2019 MCR Convention February 10, 2018, Ravenna Township Offices, Ravenna, Ohio

Attendance: Jim Williams, Bob Ashley, Jr., Jim DiPaola, Steve Zapytowski, Michael Bradley, David Hazlett, Jim Peters, Bruce Hukill

- 1. The meeting was called to order at 1:35pm.
- 2. A motion was made to approve the minutes of the 01/21/18 meeting. It was seconded and passed.
- 3. Opening reports/updates
  - a. Steve Zapytowski brought up that we need to have a table at Gary Kohler's Midwest Narrow Gauge Show 2/22-3/24 to advertise the convention and solicit the vendors. A table costs \$45 and Gary will provide us 4 passes for the show. A motion was made, seconded, and passed to spend the \$45.
  - b. Rick Ramskugler was not present to address the prototype tours.
  - C. A motion was made, seconded, and passed to approve Bruce's early registration form. His tri-fold mock-up was discussed and with some minor changes was approved for printing.
  - d. Jim Williams passed out the shirts that people had ordered, and Mike collected the money for them. It was decided to offer short sleeve versions of the dress shirt in both black and grey.
  - e. Jim DiPaola showed a sample note pad that was 5x8 inches with the bullet logo. He showed a drawing of the pen that they would pair with the note pads. They would run about 35 cents each. Larger pens run about 3x's as much.
  - f. Gary Kohler was not present but has secured a good rate for us with a printer he uses.
  - g. Mike suggested that we ask permission at the next division meeting to transfer \$1,000 into the convention checking account. A motion was made, seconded, and passed to ask for \$2,000 to be transferred. Mike stated that it was now possible to tie into the bank from our website to make credit card payments. There is a \$75 setup fee. A motion was made, seconded, and passed to pay this fee.
  - h. Steve with the help of Jim Peters and his tablet demonstrated the convention website which has a news sections. Steve said that it was already getting hits.
  - i. Steve reported that Digitrax is no longer supplying lanyards to groups. Jim DiPaola has a lead from Berea that might have some.
  - j. Steve got the e-mail problem he was having with the hotel fixed his e-mails were going to their spam folder. They have electronic signs that we can use outside rooms. Bob suggested that we find out what we can do with them the ones offered at the National Convention turned out to be expensive to use. Steve had a revised version of the hotel floor plan. Bob will convert the original PDF of the architectural drawing to a CAD drawing and then will edit to only show what rooms we will be using. Steve said that reservations will be accepted by the hotel starting June 1, 2018. People need to call the hotel directly and not the 800 service. They should use the code "MCR-NMRA".
  - k. Jim DiPaola reported that right now we have two non-rail activities; English paper piecing and making paper flowers.
  - I. Bruce will send copies of the middle and two side panels of the trifold to Jim DiPaola to use in having the display created for the roadshow. Bruce is going to create a banner for a 6' table. Mike has an electric sign that could be used. It was thought that people manning the table for the roadshow to tell others about the convention would be in period dress like is shown in the picture we have of the end run of the Bullet fedoras, wide ties and coats with wide lapels.
  - m. Jim Peters reported that he has a list of 13 tour layouts and will now add Chip Syme's layout to it.
  - n. A discussion was held about accounting software to use for the company store and silent auction. Quickbooks runs \$1,000 for a copy and a subscription is \$7/month minimum. The software "My Invoices & Estimates" was reviewed by Jim DiPaola. It provides all that Randy Dettmer needs for registrations. It would also suffice for the company Store. Bob still needs to get with Gil Smith about the auction software that we might use. It was decided to use "My Invoices & Estimates" for Randy. We will have to buy additional copies for the store and possibly the auction. A motion was made, seconded, and passed to spend \$40 for a copy of the software. We are getting the computers that Division-6 is using for their convention.
  - O. Mike said that he needed to send a copy of the decals we want on the convention car(gondola) to Accurail for the model which will have the car data already on it. David said that we needed to make sure the data was the correct time period and the decal and data fonts were the same. The car will be offered in 3 numbers.
  - p. Bruce brought up that Louisville had a problem with the lattice on the easels that they used to display their photo competition. He thought we should check with them to see what the problem was.
- 4. Color coding the badges will be accomplished by using self-adhesive colored ribbons to the bottom of the badges. The ribbon will have the person's position along with the color.


The club is on the northeast corner of the intersection. The building is a former church.


