


Division 1 Meeting Minutes September 18, 2001 Host: Jim Peters, Sagamore Hills, Ohio

The meeting was called to order at 2:13 pm by Superintendent Randy Dettmer. Twenty-five people were in attendance. Randy thanked everyone for coming. Randy thanked the Peters for hosting the meeting.



- 1. A moment of silence was observed to remember Jim Bacher who passed away last week. He will be missed by all.
- 2. A motion was made to accept the minutes of the June meeting as published in the Peddler Freight. The motion passed.
- 3. The Treasurer's report was given by Bob Ashley, Jr. A motion was made to accept the report pending audit. The motion was seconded and passed.
- 4. The membership report was presented by Jim Peters. Larry Brown was ill. The division's membership still stands at 106. A new member, Caleb Palagyi, was welcomed. Caleb is 11 years old and models the Milwaukee Road and the Chicago Northwestern in HO.

5. Committee reports:

- A. Apparel Jim Williams: three sweatshirts, one of each available weight, were on display and available for purchase. Members can have Jim process and pick-up their order for division apparel from one meeting to the next or can deal directly with Embroidme in Alliance.
- B. O, HO, N and Z Scales: Jim Williams reported that he was having a fair amount of success in finding N-scale models and supplies on the internet whereas a lot of hobby shops do not carry much N-scale. Bob Ashley, Sr. Reported that he had a Z-scale F-7 from MTL that he was sending back because of poor operation. He thought it had a gear our of round. Don Avila said that he had some of these engines and had experienced no problems.
- C. Achievement Program (David Hazlett, Chuck Boyer and Don Deakins are on the committee): No report.
- D. Clinics Jim Peters: Is still looking for participants. A sign-up sheet was passed around. Glenn Yoder will put on a clinics on grain and feed handling after ;the business meeting.
- E. Modules Bob Ashley, Sr.: The module group now has a logo that can be added above the Division 1 patch for members of the module group. You can have it added to shirts that you currently have by taking them to Embroidme in Alliance. The cost is \$6.00. Bob urged all members of the module group to have the logo added. The division's two end modules and one regular module will be used at the Division Flea Market in November.
- F. NMRA-2014 Convention: nothing to report. There has been some discussion as to how to evaluate layouts to be shown for the convention.
- 6. Member Focus: John Palagyi, Caleb's father, told the group about himself and his railroading history. He models early Conrail in HO and uses NCE DCC. His railroad is about 60% complete. His father and grand-father worked on the railroad.

7. Old Business

- A. A sign-up sheet was passed around for the holiday dinner on December 17th. It will be held in the Rose dining car at the Erie Station Restaurant in Tallmadge. The cost is yet to be determined.
- B. Peddler Freight: David Hazlett stated that he had mailed this month's copy to the 3 railroad clubs in the area: Youngstown, Sebring, and CVT. It was suggested that he put in a form that can be used to sign-up for advertising. We currently have 80 copies mailed and the rest are e-mailed. David passed out cards that could be used to designate whether you wanted to get your copy by mail or e-mail and also to make a \$15 donation. It was also suggested that we publish a list of members grouped in the same areas within the division so people will know who lives the closest to them. Perhaps the Membership Committee could supply the groupings.
- C. Flea Market 14 of the 25 tables available are rented. The module group will need one or two tables. Doug Nichols has donated a lot of items including numerous of magazines for the module group to sell to raise funds. A motion ws made, seconded, and passed that we have 750 more fliers printed to be given out at the Berea train show on October 2nd and 3rd.
- D. Randy brought up the item form the June meeting concerning the yearly contest awards. It was recalled that the members felt that wer should lnot have cash awards. Randy will take under advisement what else might be usind in addition to certificates.

8. New Business

- A. Dave Riggle has donated 4 cartons of HO locomotives, rolling stock, and models along with 3 milk crates of books and four lanterns for the division to sell to raise funds. Randy Dettmer and David Hazlett drove to southern Tuscarawas County to pick up the donation. It was suggested that Randy look at what the books and lantern were going for on Amazon.com to get a idea of what price we should put on them.
- B. Randy asked for Election Committee volunteers for next year and did not get any takers. He will be asking people to participate.
- 9. At 3:17 pm a motion was made to adjourn. It was seconded and passed.





MODULE REPORT

We have two scheduled module displays this year. Please help us with the module display setups and operations. They will be as follows and there is no admission charge:

November 6, 2011, Division 1 Flea Market, setup 11-5 November 13, 2011, Buckeye Event Center Train Show, Dalton, OH, setup 11-12-2011.

The Flea Market setup will be small and use the two end modules and one or two regular modules due to the limited space. The floor space at the 11-12-2011 Buckeye Event Center is 24'x 48' using a "1" shape layout. We will have room for about six regular modules and the Division 1 modules.

I need help laying the rest of the track on the Division modules. We now have everything in stock to finish the track and wiring, except the two curved crossings. I am also hoping that we have started the scenery before the two displays. So far, no one has offered to help.

I have eight modules at my home, ready to assemble. If you wish to purchase a module, please advise me. Call me if you wish to help any day or evening during the week.

Bob and I will be working on the Division modules on random evenings and weekends, as our schedules permit. If you can help, let us know when you can be available. We will be looking for people to help apply scenery to the division modules and build kits for buildings, also.

The price per modules is \$67.00 each for the materials and \$33.00 each for the wiring kit. This is subject to change based on current costs. Also, it does not include the mandatory NCE UTP Fascia Panel Socket for plugging in your throttle, which is available for \$17.00 from me or at The Whistle Stop. This works with Digitrax or NCE. A module can be built without a UTP. You must pay for your module prior to taking it with you.

The "Module Group" logo is available through Jim Williams for \$6.00 and can be added to your shirts. Please have this done before the upcoming displays. We will have a sign for display above the modules. Please contact me if you can help with the sign.

Scott Benson, Division 4 Module Coordinator has requested that Division 1 join them to set up modules at the next NMRA National Train Show in Grand Rapids, MI in 2012. This could involve a bus trip, with the bus pulling a trailer for the modules. The bus is driven by David James from Division 4. This trip will last at least three days and

involve hotel rooms, meals, bus fare and other related costs to each person. If anyone wants to participate, under the Division 1 banner with Division 4, let me know ASAP.

DAVID'S DCC CORNER

If any of you are still converting older locos to DCC, I have a welcome bit of news for you. I have learned that the NCE DASR decoder - REV. D has been greatly improved. The decoder, which I have used for older Athern, most Atlas, some KATO, Stewart F's and Con-Cor, now has resistors for use with LED lighting on EVERY function output as part of the decoder.

I also learned of an NCE problem with a decoder. The D13SRJ Decoder with NMRA 9 pin jack - Rev. D has a problem. If you are going to use Surface Mount Resistors on the back of the D13SRJ for led lighting the letter outputs are reversed.

F marked on the board is actually the yellow back up light wire.

R marked on the board is actually the white forward light wire.

1 marked on the board is actually the violet F2 output wire.

2 marked on the board is actually the green F1 output wire.

This <u>ONLY</u> occurs on the Rev. D Boards and does not apply to any other decoder.

As I read over what is written, I begin to understand why many model railroaders do not like DCC. Just remember, DON'T use address 49, resistors are on newer DASR boards and on newer D13SRJ boards F = R, R = F, I = 2, I = 1. Don't scream yet! Do it later. At all cost remember:

IF AT FIRST YOU DON'T SUCCEED, SKYDIVING IS NOT FOR YOU.
