Division 1, The Akron-Canton-Youngstown Division, MCR, NMRA June 14, 2009 Meeting

BONK RR (Bankers of Ohio and Northern Kentucky Railroad) with over 4 scale miles of track under **Digitrax** Digital Command Control (DCC).

Don and Carol dedicated this meeting to their fellow model railroader, Mary Lou Rice, who always came to see long trains run. Don told Mary Lou at last year's meeting at the Bonk RR that he would run even longer trains for her at this June's meeting. Mary Lou said she would be here and she was in spirit. Therefore two long trains were scheduled to run.

Passenger - NW, J class 4-8-4 with 2 express freight cars and 9 heavy weight coaches

Freight - 1 Trainmaster and H16-44 (Baby Trainmaster) diesels, 30 assorted cars and caboose

David Hazlett has said that the Bonk-RR always has something new and something planned.

First up was the raffle. This year we had 3 contributed prizes: one HO scale, one N scale and something for no real value. First was a **Roundhouse Product** 50' Combination Door Box car kit - 1937 Union Pacific. Second was a **Model Power** 40' Reefer Collector's Car-Antonio & Cleopatra Cigars. Third prize came from the Bonk RR closet, we were not sure what purpose they serve, but there are 2 of them so maybe they will mate. The cars were donated by: **Trains-N-Toys**, 1111 South Main, North Canton and **Cabinets-2-Counter Tops**, 7142 Frank Road, North Canton.

New things for this year's meeting were in repose to our visitors. We had complaints about the open staircase to the basement, so the Bonk RR boxed in the stairs. As our past visitors know there is sound in N-scale, some complained that there were no diesels with sound. That was corrected with 3 engines, 2 Trainmasters plus an E-8A unit. Unfortunately, on of the Trainmasters decoders died Saturday before the meeting.

All of the diesel sound decoders were manufactured by MRC. The Bonk-RR purchased 2 model 1636 and 2 model 1645. In both cases the decoders suffered from a 50% rejection rate. At \$25 for return and replacement or repair, that was a disappointment and MRC has been so informed. Now that one Trainmaster decoder died after less thatn an hour of operation, the reject rate looks like 75%. So how do they work?

Bonk-RR believes the sound is good, but somewhat hard

to reporgram. After several attempts the E-8A is very loud as compared to the Trainmasters. One possibility is that the Trainmasters speakers are down in the fuel tank, while the E-8A speaker is in the cab. The Atlas Trainmasters seem to run well in a consist (CV-19) (after a lengthy trial and error matching session). Since the Trainmaster decoder installation required machining of the locomotive frames the Bonk-RR farmed the job out to Al Trains & Hobbies LLC, 708 Broadway Ave, Bedford, Ohio. The price for total installation was reasonable compared to buying milled frames or shipping costs to get frames milled elsewhere. The new consist of H16-44 (Lenz decoder) and the Trainmaster (MRC sound decoder) appear to run well via the old method of given the same address to both engines.

One irritating thing with the sound decoder units, long steam engines with tender pick-ups, and consists is they are more sensitive to track work than the non-sound units. Small gaps at the rail joiners and turnouts may cause stalling, restarts and/or system shutdowns. Possible engine damage can occur when the lead engine in a consist stalls and the second engine keeps running. The Bonk-RR is still learning how to run DCC effectively.

Four volunteers were asked to run trains on the Bonk-RR. Working around the bottleneck due to the basement stairway which forces the double main line into a single main for both East and West traffic can be challenging. Trains were given different priorities just to make things interesting. The four trains had 3 different sound decoders (MRC, Lok Sound, Soundtrax) so that the meeting attendees could hear the differences. The Bonk-RR prefers Soundtrax over the others. Loc Sound is good, but the volume of the whistles or horns cannot be adjusted high enough to overcome the other sounds generated. Adding more MRC decoders is doubtful.

Finally there was food and drink available.

The Bonk-RR hopes to see you again April 18, 2010.

A concession area will be available.


