MODULE REPORT

"Day Out with Thomas"

We are working with Division Four to combine our modules with theirs and display them at the CVSR "Day Out with Thomas" event on May 21, 22, 27, 28 and 29, from 8:30 am to 5:30 pm. Please call or e-mail me if you are going to be able to help setup and operate the layout. CVSR is giving us a 30' x 100' tent for our modules. We had a combined meeting, last Wednesday, to discuss what needs to be done. Several of our members attended.

Also, there will be a booth setup to promote the NMRA. Divisions 1, 4 and 5 are going to man the booth and we will need help. If you can spare a few hours during the event, please call or e-mail me so I can put you on the list.

We met with the CVSR representative and to go over our involvement with the event and to reassure ourselves about the security. We will probably need shorter legs and cut them to suit the ground contour.

Bob and I will be working on the modules on random evenings and weekends as our schedules permit. I will be notifying the membership when we can work. If you can help, let us know when you can be available. We will be looking for people to help apply scenery to the division modules and build kits for buildings. I have had several requests for kits or finished standard modules. Those who are waiting for module kits, please be patient. I have enough material to start four modules and will need some 3/4" plywood to finish them. I have received the electrical supplies. You must pay for your module prior to taking it with you. The price is \$67.00 each for the materials and \$33.00 each for the wiring kit. This is subject to change based on current cost. Also, it does not include the mandatory NCE UTP Fascia Panel Socket for plugging in your throttle which is available for \$17.00 from me or at The Whistle Stop. This works with Digitrax or NCE. A module can be built without a UTP.

We are going to reverse the installed UTP's that are upside down and make all UTP's require that the tab is up on the plugs. I will be trying to make the socket foolproof like other sockets in the industry by adding a strip to the face of the socket.

We had an operating session the day after the March meeting and it became obvious that we need more crossovers between the mains. I'm requesting all module people to add crossovers wherever possible. This will improve the traffic flow. Some of the yard track is not laid due to lack of turnouts, which are on order, but late in arriving. We received donations to help cover the cost.

After I finish a design consulting job, anyone who wants to pay in advance and are willing to come to my house to construct the their module, please call me. I will be willing to help build their module(s). We are also looking for new module members. It will also provide a way for each member to earn the AP awards.

For those who help at the "Day Out with Thomas" event, there will be time for your family and children to visit the other activities and eat at the concession. This is a free event, except for the train ride and the cost of the food. Please call or e-mail me for information.



WHY DECODERS RUN AWAY or RESET

The comments in this article are excerpts from an article by Jim Betz as printed on the website for Tony's Train Exchange.

Why do locos run away? Basically all decoders check to see if DC (CV29) is allowed by the decoder. If you have the DC allowed on your decoder, a check the decoder does at startup may mis-read the power available. Thus the loco takes off like the proverbial Bat!

Another reason for the run away loco is an intermittent short in the layout. This short could cause the decoder to mis-read CV29.

<u>What to do?</u> Set the decoder to NOT allow DC (analog) operation. Correct shorts in the layout. Use circuit breakers on the layout.

Why do decoders reset? About the same reason; misreading the settings at start up, probably due to a short. Only the QSI Revolution decoders provide a way to set the values in the "factory reset information" to your own programmed values. All you have to do is update the reset info using the QSI Programmer. Then the decoder cannot reset to factory settings. Personally, I keep a file of all the CV's that I have changed on a decoder. That makes it is easy enough to reset them all on the main or program track.

Both run away and reset problems are mostly caused by shorts. How to get rid of shorts? Good track and switch standards.

Also, the most common source of a short is someone running a turnout/switch. The next most common is a derailment (probably caused by running a switch).

So, train your operators sufficiently so that they will not run a switch . . . as often. Operators, take a little more care. For the summer try working on the shorts on your layout.

The meeting was called to order at 2:10 pm by Superintendent Randy Dettmer. Twenty-three people were in attendance. Randy thanked Jim for hosting the meeting.

- 1. A motion was made to accept the minutes of the March meeting as published in the <u>Peddler Freight</u>. The motion was seconded and passed.
- 2. The Treasurer's report was given by Bob Ashley, Jr. A motion was made to accept the report pending audit. The motion was seconded and passed.
- 3. The membership report was made by Larry Brown. The division's membership stands at 102 with one new member, Norman Robinson from Barberton. A new member pack will be sent out.
- 4. Committee reports:

HO Scale David Hazlett reported that the new "Titan" QSI sound decoder was 64 bits and that the programming needed to be purchased from QSI to really tweak it; for about \$120 you get prerecorded sounds, a speaker, and documentation. Chuck Boyer reported that to get all the sounds offered in MTH engines you needed to purchase their sound system. Bob Ashley, Sr. stated that MRC now claims that their sound decoders are "bullet proof and their past problems have been fixed.
 - d. Z Scale Don Avila nothing to report.
 - e. Modules Bob Ashley, Sr.
 - i. Kurt Sanders has CD's of pictures and videos of the modules' construction and operation available. Any donations to the module effort would be appreciated.
 - ii. Bob Ashley, Jr brought the model building kits to the meeting for anyone who wanted to take and construct one for the modules. Randy Dettmer has already built one and Bill Bigler, Jim DiPaola, and Jim Williams have each taken one.
 - iii. The modules will be setup for the CVSR "Day Out With Thomas", the Dalton show next November 13th, and for the 2014 National Convention. The "Day Out With Thomas" will be 8:30 am to 6:30 pm May 21st and 22nd and May 27th, May 28th, and May 29th. Volunteers are needed.


- a. Membership roster




