Superintendents Message

At the April meeting nominations from the membership will still be taken for the upcoming election. If after reading the candidate statements you think you would like to have an additional person run for any of the positions, you have the opportunity to nominate them. Yes, that also includes my position. Voting will take place via mail and/or at the May meeting using a printed ballot. Ballots will be in the May Peddler Freight. Elections are held according to the By-Laws.

My "Membership Report" in the <u>Peddler Freight</u> was misunderstood by some members of Division 1. Therefore, the new title is "NMRA Membership Report."

The <u>Peddler Freight</u> report consists ONLY of NMRA members. You are automatically a Division 1 member and a Mid-Central Region member without any further cost because you are an NMRA member. You cannot be a Division 1 member UNLESS you are an NMRA member. Non-NMRA persons may attend Division 1 meetings, but are officially considered a visitor.

Additional confusion comes from the <u>Peddler Freight</u> subscription. Many of us pay \$15 for a subscription to the <u>Peddler Freight</u>, for which the Division is most grateful. That list is occasionally printed in the <u>Peddler Freight</u>. That subscription does not buy a membership in the Division; it only helps us pay to print and mail the <u>Peddler Freight</u>. As an aside, I pay for a subscription and as does the <u>Peddler Freight</u> Editor, Bill Smith.

More confusion is created by the Roster, which is made up of railroaders who have given permission to have their names, phone numbers, email addresses, etc. printed to permit easy contact with others. There is no cost for the Roster; it only goes to those who receive the Peddler Freight. It is not put on the website.

There can be many reasons for failure to renew NMRA membership. Among those reasons is the economy, frustration with NMRA and/or this Division, a move out of the area, age or forgetfulness (my favorite). It can take a month or more to get renewals updated to the membership list that is sent to this Division.


APRIL DESTINATIONS SUNDAY - APRIL 20, 2008 SAGAMORE HILLS

<u>Division One will have modules.</u> The response has been slim to almost none. However, a "very few" of us intend to go ahead with the project. We had a partially built Division 1 module to show the details that are in the construction at Sebring. We will have HO, N AND Z Gauge types of modules. Some of us are going to incorporate them into their home layouts and take them out when the time comes to set them up for display. Those of you who attended the March meeting saw how Don Bonk did just that.

We will begin construction as soon as the weather breaks because all my woodshop equipment is in my garage which is not well heated. I will e-mail or call those, who have shown any interest at all, probably in May. We will plan to work on a Saturday or Sunday or both. Please let me know if you will participate. I will schedule a Building Session at my home and have materials available. We will have time to make a module(s) and detail it so that can be shown at the Berea Carnival in October, joining with Division 4's modules. Building a module is rather simple and, working together, several can be built quickly. The module can then be taken home for detailing by the owner.

If you want a module, but, you can't attend a Building Session, we can build one for you as long as you are willing to pay for the materials. We can't price the materials yet due to the lack of response. We need some quantities to help lower the price.

HO gauge specs can be downloaded by logging on to Division 4's website at http://www.div4.org. Scroll down to MODULE SPECS and print the HO module instructions. The specs for N gauge can be found at http://www.ntrak.org. These inexpensive specs must be ordered from the NTRAK organization. The Z gauge specs are called Z-BEND TRACK and can be downloaded by logging on to their website at http://www.zbendtrack.com/ and clicking on PDF Z-BEND TRACK STANDARDS. All these specs are meeting the NMRA standards or are in committee for approval.

Division 1 Meeting Minutes - March 30, 2008 The home of Don Bonk, Louisville, Ohio

The meeting was called to order at 2:00 PM by Superintendent David Hazlett. 19 people were present. The minutes of February's meeting, as printed in the <u>Peddler Freight</u>, were approved. The Treasurer's report was presented and accepted subject to audit. The Superintendent David Hazlett reported that the NMRA membership for Division 1 was down 11 people to 100.

David asked for column authors and clinic presenters. Anyone interested should contact him. We need column authors for all scales along with individual articles on member's model railroads and also on prototype railroads.

The next meeting is on April 20th at Dan Williams' home in Sagamore Hills. Dan is a Master Model Railroader. Directions will be published in the April Peddler Freight.

Bob Ashely reported on the patches and clothing that Division-1 has for sale. We now, thanks to David, have red and black totes for sale at \$10 a piece.

Bob Ashley reported on the building of division modules. Jim Bacher stated that his business owns a house in the Portage Lakes area off of Manchester Road near Coventry Plaza that the division could use as a module construction site.

Bill Smith reported on the buildings that we have for sale. Bill has placed an order and it will be here for the next meeting. Two of the HO buildings in this order are already sold. He currently has one HO scale and one N scale kit for sale.

Frank Williamson reported on the slate for the elections in May. There were no further nominations from the floor at this meeting so the candidates are

David Hazlett for Superintendent, Bob Ashley for Assistant Superintendent Bob Ashley Jr. for Treasurer.

The people running need to write a short, one paragraph biography for the April <u>Peddler Freight</u>. Ballots will be in the May <u>Peddler Freight</u> and need to be brought to the May meeting. The ballot can be mailed in; but if this is done, then the ballot must have the Peddler Freight address label still on it to verify who it is from.

There was discussion about the Division's web site. Ivan Baugh is our webmaster and does this for free. David had two other options: using GoDaddy.com as a host would cost \$58.20 per year or \$112.12 for two years, or a Jimmy Stockard would make and maintain a website for us for \$24.95 a month. There was a motion and a second that David and Ivan checkout the best way to have the website hosted and to grant them the authority to proceed with the recommendation that we only contract for a year and that we get a record of the site's hits. The motion carried.

Upcoming train shows were discussed.

Bob Ashley showed the group a brochure that he made up on his own initiative to advertise Division-1 and the NMRA. It contains a map showing the boundaries of division-1 and the region. He has passed it out at the Whistlestop, Nick's, and Toys and Trains along with an accompanying NMRA flyer. He has distributed 36 so far. The brochure looks very professional and he was encouraged by the group in his efforts.

David noted that the national NMRA ballot is in the February Scale Rails and must be turned in by April 15th to be counted. There are 3 issues on standards that people might want to vote on.

David also suggested that if anyone is going to the regional convention hosted by Division-4 they might want to wear some of our Division-1 attire.


