January 06, 2019, Ravenna Township Offices, Ohio

- 1) The meeting was called to order at 1:30 pm.
- 2) King Pin: Bruce put together an 18-page article on the upcoming convention for submission. Steve had to reduce it to 12 pages after he was informed that there was a length restriction. He left out the waiver forms and salvaged everything else by using tighter margins and a smaller font.
- 3) Minutes: there were two corrections to the last meeting minutes: Sam Eisele is not the backup for David Hazlett's operating session and there are vegetarian options for the menu. A motion was made and seconded to accept the minutes as corrected. The motion passed
- 4) Treasurer's Report: Michael Brantley gave the report and will pay a \$600 deposit to BRH bus service.
- 5) Registration: Randy reported that we have 27 registrations so far and have processed one credit card payment.
- 6) Volunteers: Luana passed out a list of coverage and contacts she had prepared. This was reviewed by the group. There were several revisions including that the bus pickup would be at the convention lobby and not the hotel lobby.
- 7) Vendors: nothing new from Gary Kohler. We have payment from one vendor and all 11 tables are spoken for.
- 8) Punch list: Steve created a punch list of items for each area of the convention. It was reviewed, and everyone was asked to consider all that needed to be done in their areas.
 - a) Mike Bradley is paying for the plaques. We still have to settle on what type of material will be mounted on the wood bases – brass, plastic, etc.
 - b) Shirt orders need to all be turned into Jim Williams by April 19th.
 - c) We will stuff bags at the regular March 17th meeting.
 - d) The timetable must be at the printer March 27th.
- 9) Convention car: our order will be for 150 cars at a cost of \$16.99 a car. Mike needs to send Accurail a check for \$1,274.25 which is half the cost, to get the production started.

N-SCALE REPORT

Programming Track issues have been raised by three separate modelers in the past two months. There are three different approaches shown below:







For some reason when people hear the need for a separate programming track, Figure 1 is what they quickly install.

The truly separate track (Figure 1) is the least efficient, most cumbersome configuration to use. With this approach, you place and align all the wheels of a locomotive on track, program it, and then place it on the layout. This is cumbersome and can lead to damaged Locos. This becomes more so if the loco is a Centipede or a Northern (4-8-4) with 6 wheel or centipede tender trucks which becomes a victim of damage.

The spur track approach shown in Figure 2 is much better if you have a spur or can put one on your layout. You handle the loco once and only need decide whether it exits the siding running forward or reverse after programming. This type of programming track is what is successfully used on ACY NTRAK modules.

The siding approach (Figure 3) or a variation is the best concept to adopt. You need decide which direction you wish the loco to exit while handling the loco only once. If you have the space for a long programming section of track it can be used to verify your programming efforts or match engines for multi-unit operation with some type of timing apparatus. This siding approach is what is used on home layout. Lacking the space for a long siding, you could isolate a section of main line for use as a programming track. Operating or Direct Mode programming can be done on spur or sidings tracks if you own a second command station. Add it and an additional DPDT switch to this isolated section of track. While operating mode programming with other locos running on the layout is an acceptable method of programming, it has some risk. There have been reports of flash over where multiple locos were unintentionally programmed, especially with earlier (older) model decoders.

Figures were developed by Digitrax.

In the above paragraph, loco matching was mentioned and a number of articles have been written covering this subject. Two interesting articles are; **An Easy Way to Speed-Match Locomotives** <http://cs.trains.com/mrr/f/744/t/135008.aspx> and **Speed-Matching Dissimilar Locomotives** by Dan Fretz. Fretz's article covers a number of different decoders noting things like ESU LokSound decoders have up to 1000 CVs. Some all of the earlier (older) decoders may not have CVs that allow for easy programming and Fretz does not cover Broadway Limited decoders which have detailed instructions for their version of multi-unit operations.

NTRAK Modules are currently planned for display at the **Midwest Narrow Gauge Show**, March 22nd and 23rd, with setup on the 21st.

Finally, have you registered for the Bullet Regional Yet? It is not too late!




