For those of you who would like to have a logging railroad and without all the "saw mill" equipment needed to justify such a railroad here is a suggestion . . .

Have the railroad line terminate at a dock . . .a nice wooden piling affair. A body of water large enough to hold a large number of logs. The logs can be lashed into log booms for shipment to the saw mill located somewhere off the railroad layout. Often small tugs are used to jockey the logs into position so they can be made into a raft. The logs on the outer edges of the raft are chained together to keep the raft intact. A somewhat larger tug can be available for the actual towing job.

How can you go wrong with a logging railroad PLUS a harbor scene???

Minutes of the MCR BOD meeting April 28, 2006 will soon be posted on the MCR web site. I urge all to read the important items there that affect the region.

The next BOD meeting will be October 15, 2006 and will be held at the Reynoldsburg, Ohio Library. I have asked the BOD for their recommendations for the Director's Award and the Russ Wenderfer Award for that meeting.

#### **SCALE RAILS**

At the NMRA convention in Philadelphia, a meeting was held with the various Division newsletter editors and representatives of the various NMRA publications.

One of the subjects discussed was the NMRA "Scale Rails" magazine. New editor Stephen Priest was present, and while he didn't bring along samples of the reformatted magazine, everyone who's seen preproduction copies of it has said it'll be very impressive. He was asked how he sees the magazine being different from the newsstand publications. (His first issue is the September issue.) He answered that he wants to change the image of "Scale Rails" from being a "5-minute magazine." Because the NMRA is an organization of people, not objects, he plans to focus on model railroading and peoples' relationships to it - why people do what they do in our hobby. He plans to include more Recommended Practices in the magazine, too, and will report oh how well new products meet existing NMRA RP's. This will help give "teeth" to the RP program again.

Publisher Larry De Young emphasized that the magazine will run negative product reviews if the product warrants it, even at the risk of losing an advertiser.

## **Web Master Report**

Our Region web site continues to increase in usage. Since the report provided for the Board of Directors at their meeting, April 28, 2006, 66 days have passed. During this time our web site has experienced 13,992 sessions; the software tracking the usage defines a session as "a series of Hits to your site over a specific period of time by one visitor." Our site averaged 212 sessions per day. We had 41 days during this period that exceed 200 sessions per day with 25 days having less than 200 sessions per day. The highest number of sessions for one day was 292 with 284 being the second highest number of sessions.

During this same period of time 25,455 pages have been viewed; the tracking software defines a pageview as "a request to the web server by a visitor's browser for any web page." This is an increase of 193 pages over the previous period. Our site averaged 389 pageviews per day. We had 8 days when there were over 500 pageviews. The highest number of pageviews for one day was 774 with 722 being the second highest number of pageviews.

The total number of hits during this period is 48,296; this represents "Any successful request to a webserver from a visitor's browser." Our site averaged 732 hits per day. We had 8 days with over 1,000 hits for the day. The highest number of hits for one day was 1,327 with 1,232 being the second highest number of hits for one day.

These frequently visited pages helped generate the above traffic: 2000 Contest winners, Layout tours, Scouting Merit Badge pages, Board of Directors' page, Schedule, Fallen Flags, and Divisions each had over 150 pageviews each during this period; 48 pages had over 100 pageviews during this time.

As you can see, our web site continues to enjoy good use. Thank you for contributing to the site and making it even better. When you find a good site, please send the webmaster an email that includes the web address. I will gladly add it to our web site in an appropriate place. I would also like to add additional layout tours to our web site. They are quite popular. Please send me your layout tour. If you need help developing it, please send me an email. I will gladly assist you. A layout tour earns author points in the NMRA Achievement program.

## **Have You Registered Your Pike?**

The Pike Registry, part of the NMRA's Membership Services and Promotion Department, is one of the lesser known services of the NMRA, yet it's been around almost as long as the organization itself. By sending in an application to program manager Dick Schneider, along with a \$10 donation, NMRA members can register the name and reporting marks of their model railroad in the Official Register of Model Railroads (ORMRR) for two years. In return they receive an official registration certificate along with a CD of the current ORMRR. (Printed versions are also available to those without computers.)

The ORMRR is a tremendous resource for those who travel and would like to visit model railroads during their trip. The Register lists names, addresses and phone numbers of registrants, along with visitation preferences.

Studying the ORMRR is fun in and of itself. Currently it contains well over 500 pikes, some of which are as yet unbuilt. Among those appearing are prototypical names such as Union Pacific and Burlington Northern. But others have registered more whimsical names, such as the Kneedy & Lackamoney and the Downe & Owlte. It makes for great reading.

The Pike Registry was updated and streamlined last year and is now a self-supporting volunteer-run part of the NMRA Membership Services and Promotion Department. Besides the fun of receiving an official certificate and the ORMRR, it gives members a great way to make a small donation to the NMRA.


